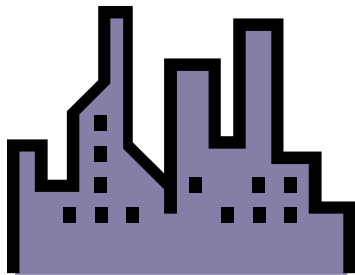


AROUND THE BUILDING

The station is located just off the main parking area at the Notebaert Nature Museum, at 2340 N. Cannon Drive, It is the 16th recycling drop-off center in the City.

The center is open to everyone but will be particularly convenient for residents of the Lincoln Park area or anyone driving on North Lake Shore Drive.

City drop-off recycling centers are open during daylight hours and collect paper, plastics, glass, and metal cans. Yard waste is not accepted.
